This bound volume, entitled Aces: 1976-1981, is one of two written by Topekan Lee Dodson documenting the activities of youth and semi-pro baseball teams that he managed from the late 1960s through 1981. Each of the teams included one or more of his three sons (Jim, Dick and Steve) as participants, whether as player, field manager, coach, or batboy. In this volume are Dodson's annual reports about the Topeka Aces (1976-79), the Topeka Pepsi-Cola Braves (1980), and the Topeka 7Uppers (1981). The 1976 and 1977 Topeka Aces teams competed in the Eastern Kansas Mickey Mantle League, and were composed of players aged 15 and 16. The 1978 and 1979 Aces played in the senior Babe Ruth division for players 16-18. Both the Topeka Pepsi-Cola Braves and the Topeka 7Uppers were semi-pro teams that were members of the Kaw Valley Semi-Pro Baseball League. Reports on the six teams include not only individual player statistics, but detailed narrative accounts of every game played by each team. The companion volume covers the period 1966-1973 (see Kansas Memory ID 309526). Throughout his adult life, Lee Dodson was a leader in Topeka's baseball community who became known as Topeka's 'r. Baseball.' A former minor league pitcher, Dodson founded and managed several leagues in Topeka, and managed and/or coached countless teams. Digital reproduction of the volume was accomplished through a joint project sponsored by the Kansas Historical Society and the Shawnee County Baseball Hall of Fame.

score of 4-3. As we came into the bottom half of the seventh we put forth our most supreme effort, as Todd Bohannon led off with a base on balls. After Taylor's flyout, Mike Harmon moved Todd around to third on a slashing single to right.

Wike soon stole second and we had the tying and winning runs at second and third with one away. Mike Griffiths came up and drew life on an infield error to load the bases whereupon Davey Lord came up and unleashed a tremendous smash to the right center field wall for a three base hit, scoring the two runs necessary to win the game and we won - going away by the score of 5-4. It was indeed a thriller.

Steve gained his fourth victory against one setback and we had won our tenth game against three setbacks. This was an important game as Post 199 appeared to be one of our stronger contenders for the league championship. Hitting heroes were of course Dave Lord with his tremendous triple in addition to a single earlier, Mike Harmon had two timely blows, Fred Palenske a single, and that constituted all of our hits which we received but five in all. Meanwhile Steve was holding the 199's to five hits himself.

GAME FOURTEEN

In the second game of the doubleheader we had our right hand fireballer - curveballer Dave Lord on the hill and the Legionnaires began erupting early by gaining life on two errors and then Dave was successful in retiring the next two hitters whereupon still another error, the third, in the inning plated two runs and we were quickly down 2-0. In our half of the first Mike Harmon drew a base on balls and Fred Palenske strolled but both runners were left abandoned and no further damage done - no score.

As we moved into the second inning the Legionnaires led 2-0. Davey sent the opponents down in order 1-2-3. In our second we roared back and took the lead by scoring three runs as Dave Greene drew a base on balls; Yves Adams, a big black young man had joined our club this day, playing third base, singled into right field moving Dave Greene around third. Todd Bohannon grounded out but Greene

scored on the play. Kipp Noe drew a base on balls and Mike Harmon forced Kipp; later Mike Griffiths unloaded a slash down the left field line for a base hit scoring Adams and Harmon and three runs were the result. In the Post 199 half of the inning Dave experienced no problems; nor in the fourth. Meanwhile we were doing nothing in our third and fourth - going down in order, with the exception of Mike Harmon's single. In the Legion's fifth they came back and scored two more runs on a walk and followed by a double and a single. The score was now Post 199 4 and our own Topeka Aces 4. In our half of the fifth we scored one as Mike Harmon singled and came around on single by Fred Palenske, a walk to Steve Dodson and a groundout. We led 5-4.

Dave experienced no problems in the sixth, setting them down in order. In our sixth we scored two more runs as with two away Mike Harmon laced a long triple, scored on Mike Griffiths' single and he later scored on a fly ball tagup. Dave experienced no problems in their seventh other than giving up a base on balls, and we won the ball game by the score of 7-4. Dave in winning his fourth victory against no losses gave us a win/loss record of 11 and 3. We had but seven hits in all ourselves; two each by Mike Harmon, one a triple, Mike Griffiths, one a double, two by Fred Palenske and one by Yves Adams. Davey struck out ten legionnaire batters in posting his victory.

On June 15th we held a practice session game with Post #400 interchanging our players and no records were kept.

GAME FIFTEEN

On June 27 we travelled to Eisenhower Field in Kansas City, Kansas, where we met the Kansas City Elliott Arms team in the first game of a doubleheader.

We sent Davey Lord to the hill and he responded with a beautifully pitched ball game allowing but three scattered hits while we were hitting relatively well amassing a total of eight bingles, scoring five runs. In our visiting half of the first Mike Harmon, who has been on a hitting tear, led off with a double and

scored moments later on Mike Griffiths' equally torrid hitting spree with a double and Mike scored later on a flyball to give us a 2-0 lead. Davey experienced no problems in the first inning, he gave up a run in the second inning due largely to two errors - a hit batsman and a walk. In our second inning we threatened with a single by the new player who joined our club, Brett Holtom, now playing second base. An error on Steve Conwell's groundball gave us two runners but no runs. In the third inning, we scored one run when Fred Palenske singled, stole second base, Steve Dodson walked, Brett Holtom singled to score Fred. In the third inning for the Arms' club they went down in order. In our fourth inning we scored two more when Bruce Benteman walked, moved to second on a single by Mike Harmon, bases became loaded on Mike Griffiths' free pass and a moment later Fred Palenske plated two of the runs with another base hit up the middle. We now led by the score of five to one. Davey continued to mow down the opponents until the fifth inning when he met brief trouble giving up a single and a walk but no runs. We did nothing in our fifth.

In our sixth, we did likewise. In their sixth, Davey sent them down in order. In the ACES half of the seventh we wasted a single by Steve Dodson and did not score. In their seventh the Kansas City Arms gave us somewhat of a minor scare when they had back to back singles coupled with an error to score one run but that was it as Dave settled down to strike out McMahan to end the game and we won by the score of 5 to 2. Davey won his fifth victory against no losses and we had won our 12th game against three losses. Dave struck out 13 Elliott Arms hitters while scattering the three hits off him. We had eight hits in all including two by Mike Harmon, two by Fred Palenske and two by Brett Holtom. One each was struck by Mike Griffiths and Steve Dodson.

GAME SIXTEEN

In the second game of the doubleheader we sent big right hander Steve Dodson to the hill to face McMann as opposition. In our first inning our only threat was

a wasted single to Mike Harmon, who led off, but was stranded. Steve gave up a triple to Pierce in their half of the first but he did not score. In our second inning we threatened again when Steve Dodson doubled, Dave Greene was hit by a pitched ball and both runners moved over by a fielder's choice but no scoring ensued. The Kanses City Arms erupted in their second by scoring four big runs in the following manner: a walk, a hit batsman, a double, another walk, a costly error in the infield and another walk. Before we knew it four tallies had scored. Trailing four to nothing we moved into our third inning and began our scoring when Mike Griffiths doubled and scored later on a single by Fred Palenske. In the bottom of the third Steve set them down in order. In our fourth a minor flurry took place when Dave Greene walked and Brett Holtom singled and Kipp Noe drew life on an error but no runs scored. In their fourth in what proved to be a costly inning for us in the game's outcome, Steve gave up a single and two hit batsmen followed by still another single and two runs scored to give them a 6-1 lead. We did relatively nothing until the seventh inning tho we had a single wasted by Rick Taylor back in the sixth and a walk to Brett Holtom wasted. Meanwhile Steve was having no more problems with Elliott Arms. In our seventh we made a valiant effort as Mike Griffiths led off with a single down the line, Dave Lord followed suite with a single past third, Palenske drew a walk to load the bases, Steve Conwell ran for him. Steve Dodson singled up the middle, driving home two runs and making the score more interesting now, 6-3. Dave Greene forced Steve at second the Steve Conwell scored to now make it 6-4. Todd Bohannon gained life as a result of a fielder's choice and with two out Brett Holtom singled to bring to bat Gil Gonzales, who in one of his rare appearances, singled into right field to make it really interesting as Bohannon scored. Holtom rounding third on the play attempted to go all the way as Coach Charlie Lord sent him and he was thrown out in a close play at home and We went down by the score of 6-5 in a real close tough one to lose. Steve suffered the loss - his second against four victories - and we suffered our fourth against

twelve wins. We had ten hits in all - including two each by Mike Griffiths, steve Dodson and Brett Holtom. One blow was struck by Gil Gonzales, Rick Taylor, Fred Palenske and Dave Lord.

GAME SEVENTEEN

Game seventeen we hosted the Lawrence American Legion team at Ripley Park on June 28th. Dave Greene took the hill against the right hand slants of Marson for Lawrence. The Lawrence team broke ice in the first inning when they scored two runs as a result of an error, a single and still another error. We came back in our first inning for a double by Mike Griffiths but no scoring. Dave gave up a harmless single in the second to Lawrence and we continued to trail 2-0. In our second we proceeded to tie up the ball game when Steve Dodson led off with a walk, followed by a stroll given to Davey Greene. Kipp Noe drew life on an error and Ricky Taylor singled to drive in one run and the score was now 2-2. Dave settled down in the third and set them down 1-2-3 as did their pitcher to us in our third.

In the fourth Dave gave up a run when he hit a batsman and walked a runner and gave up a single to their pitcher; it was now 3-2. In our fourth they changed pitching, relieving with Herrod. He walked Dave Greene but he retired the next three in order. In the fifth Dave gave up two costly runs when a walk followed by a single and a double plated two runs and we now trailed by the score of five to two. In our fifth we threatened when Mike Griffiths was hit by a pitched ball and Davey Lord singled. Steve Dodson walked to fill the bases but no runs were produced. In the sixth we brought in Brett Holtom to do the pitching honors and he proceeded to strike out the side of the Lawrence hitters. In our sixth we came back with two big tallies against their new pitcher Sinks when Dave Greene was pinch-hit for by Bruce Benteman and Bruce walked. Brett Holtom walked, Kipp Noe singled and Mike Harmon plated two runs with a line drive single to left center and we now trailed by the score of five to four. In the visitor's seventh they pro-

ceeded to move ahead of us six to four when their leadoff hitter singled and scored later on a sacrifice fly after a walk. We trailed 6-4. Going into the bottom of the seventh the unbelievable occurred when we scored three big runs to win the game on no hits. With two away and nobody on and next to no chance of ever winning, Bruce Benteman walked; Brett Holtom then walked, giving us a slight flicker - remembering with two outs. Kipp Noe drew a base on balls to load the sacks yet with two outs. Todd Bohannon came up and likewise walked, forcing in a run making it six to five with the tying run on third. Mike Harmon coming to bat then was struck by a pitched ball in a convenient place giving us the tying run and the score miraculously became 6-6. And then Mike Griffiths hit a conventional soft popup to their second baseman Green, who of all things dropped the ball allowing Kipp Noe to score from third with the third and winning run. Three runs on no hits - a total of four walks, a hit batsman and an error plated the three runs and we won on a gift, the winning pitcher being Brett Holtom, his first victory against no losses and our 13th win against 4 losses as a team. We had but six hits against the combined pitching of the Legionnaires from Lawrence, the six being two by Davey Lord and individual shots by Mike Harmon, Mike Griffiths. Kipp Noe and Ricky Taylor.

GAME EIGHTEEN

We met the Kansas City American Legion Post Number 399 team at McDonald Field in a doubleheader, June 30. To do the hurling honors of the first game was Davey Lord against the slants of Mark Blake for our opponents. Dave had no trouble in the first, striking our two of their three hitters. In our first we combed Blake for a total of no hits but gathered one run as a result of an error and three walks. Dave continued to experience no problems with the Legionnaires tho he gave up the only hit of the game to Kevin Bybee in the second inning to the 399's. Dave went on to mow them down almost 1-2-3 in every inning with the exception of the fifth and the seventh which were marred slightly by walks.

Hearnwhile our one run garnered in the first was enough for a victory, however,
we began pounding away and in the third Mike Griffiths doubled, Davey singled,
fred Palenske drew life on a fielder's choice and Steve Dodson doubled to give us
two more runs. In our fourth Kipp Noe singled with sacrifice to second and scored
noments later on Mike Harmon's drive to right. In our fifth we scored four more
big ones when after two away Steve Dodson singled, Dave Greene singled, Brett
Holtom beat out an infield grounder and Kipp Noe walked. Todd Bohannon then
singled and the four runs were across. In our sixth we had two more tallies,
when Mike Griffiths walked, Fred lPalenske got on as a result of an error and
Steve Dodson walked, Bruce Benteman walked and an error gave us our total of ten
runs. We had nine hits. Davey in his sparkling one hitter struck out a total of
eight. Our hits were divided among the following: two by Steve Dodson, one each
by Mike Harmon, Mike Griffiths, Dave Lord, Brett Holtom, Kipp Noe, Todd Bohannon
and Dave Greene. Davey enjoyed his sixth straight victory against no losses and
lie were now 14 to 4 overall.

GAME NINETEEN

Game Mineteen took place - the second half of the doubleheader - this

time with a big new pitcher for us, Eric Alejos, a left hander, taking the hill

against Bryan, a right hander for the Legion 399 team. Eric, a hard throwing

left hander somewhat wild, had no problems in the first nor did Bryan for the

legionnaires for us. In the second they garnered a single off Eric along with two

base on balls but no runs scored. In our second we broke locse with four big

tallies as Fred Palenske singled followed by a single through the middle by Steve

Dodson. Both runners moved around to third and second respectively on Kipp Noe's

groundout. Todd Bohannon walked to fill the bases and Ricky Taylor gained life

on an error allowing two runs to score, later Todd scored on another error on

Eric Alejos' groundball. Mike Griffiths walked and a wild pitch plated the

fourth run. We now led four to nothing. In the visitors' third only a two base

hit threatened us; no runs scored. We did nothing of major effort in our third

other than a walk to Steve Dodson. In their fourth they went down on strikes in order. In our fourth we had a walk given up to Mike Griffiths but no runs. In the visitors' fifth again three strikeouts after an error was their effort.

In our fifth we threatened slightly on a walk to Fred and a walk to Steve Conwell but no runs scored. Fred Palenske came in and relieved and did well experiencing no problems in their sixth. In our sixth we went down in order and Fred wrapped it up in their seventh giving up one run on a base on balls and a double and we won by a score of five to one. The victory going to Eric Alejos, the hard throwing left hander, his first victory against no losses and we experienced our fifteenth victory against four losses. We had but two hits in amassing a total of five runs those being by Steve Dodson and Fred Palenske. Base on balls hurt their pitching and tight pitching by Eric and Fred helped us. Fred got credit for the save.

GAME THENTY

Game twenty was played at Ripley Park on the second of July where we met the Suburban A's for the third time of the year. Steve Dodson was assigned the task of hurling and was opposed by Blakely, a right hander for the Athletics.

We opened with two quick runs when Mike Harmon walked, and Mike Griffiths drew life on an error. Both runners moved around on a passed ball and later scored on groundball and a flyout. The A's bounced back with a run on a single and a double and we led 2-1 at the end of one. In our second Ricky Taylor singled but was left stranded. In their second they tied it up on a walk and a stolen base plus an error. At the end of two it was two to two. In the third we began to break it open when we scored four big runs on six hits. With one away Mike Griffiths singled, stole second, Davey Lord plated him with a single to left, Fred Palenske bombed a double to deep left center. Todd Bohannon singled home Dave. Rick Taylor then drove home Fred with a single and Kipp Noe contributed by still another single up the middle and before it was over four runs had been plated. Steve had no trouble in the third. In our fourth we went down in order.

In their fourth Steve gave up a harmless base on balls. In our fifth we added one more run when Steve walked, moved to second on a walk given up to Todd Bohannon and was plated later on a fielder's choice of Ricky Taylor's groundball. In their fifth no harm was done. In the sixth we scored our 8th run when Dave Greene walked, followed by a base on balls issued to Mike Harmon and Dave scored later on a flyball hit by Dave Lord to left which he was able to tagup.

Steve got into hot water in the seventh leading 8-2, he let up somewhat and gave up a pair of walks and a pair of hits along with an error and three A's scored before they went down on strikes, making the final score 8-5 our ACES. It was Steve's fifth victory against two losses and our 16th win overall over four losses. We had seven hits in all, two by Ricky Raylor and one each by Mike Griffiths, Davey Lord, Fred Palenske, Todd Bohannon and Kipp Noe.

GAME TWENTY-ONE

Me moved to Kansas City at Highland Park Field on the fifth of July to meet the Kansas City American Legion #199 team in a doubleheader. This turned out to be a long and discouraging evening for us as we ran into umpiring problems again in the form of Mr. Randall. In the first game we sent Davey Lord to the hill and he was opposed by McHenry for the Legion team. We did nothing in the first tho Mike Harmon walked and was thrown out at second attempting to steal. The Legionnaires began their half with a hit, a stolen base and a tag-up of a flyball to score and they led 1-0. We did nothing in our second other than a walk to Dave Greene. In their second they went 1-2-3. In our third we did have a hit, this one by Mike Griffiths following Mike Harmon's single but it was to no avail as we could not score. In their third they plated still another run on two solid base hits and an error, one a double by Sostarich, and we now trail 2-0.

In our fourth we broke ice when with two away Steve Dodson singled, moved to second on an error and scored later on a RBI single by Rick Taylor. Now 2-1. In their fourth they did get one more hit off Dave with two away but no one scored.

In our fifth we made it interesting again as we were trailing at the time 2-1 when we moved into the lead, with one away Eric Alejos gained life on an error and then after Mike Harmon went down on strikes Mike Griffiths singled, Dave Lord walked to fill the bases, Fred Palenske singled driving in two tallies and we were able to garner three big runs and the score was now 4-2. In their half of the inning they came back with two runs to tie it up at 4 all. Three errors in our infield around a hit batsman got us into trouble. No hits were garnered off Dave. As we go into the sixth tied up 4-4, a walk to Rick Taylor was the only thing we could do. In their sixth problems arose when with one away a single, a walk and a costly RBI single plated two runs and we were down by the score 6-4. We did not give up however and we went into the seventh. Mike Griffiths doubled and scored later on an error, Steve walked, stole second and as the tying run on with two away our last hitter went down on strikes and we ended the game losing 6-5. It was a frustrating loss. It was a hard fought difficult game to accept but we lost it.

Davey Lord experienced his first loss against seven victories and it was our

fifth loss against sixteen wins. We had a total of seven hits in the game three hits by the hard hitting Mike Griffiths and one each by Fred Palenske,

Steve Dodson, Rick Taylor and Todd Bohannon.

He move to game twenty-two, the second half of the doubleheader and we sent fric Alejos to the hill, with umpire Randall behind the plate we were in for a long evening, and it turned out just that way.

In our first Davey Lord's single went for naught as he was stranded. In their first only a walk was given to ruin an otherwise perfect inning. In our second inning Steve Dodson unleashed a double in left center, followed by an error of Rick Raylor's groundball and with one away Kipp Noe singled through the center score Steve and move Rick Taylor around to third. Eric then walked and Ricky Taylor scored on a fielder's choice of Mike Griffiths' groundball and we

had two runs on the four hits in the inning. However in the second inning an unbelievable occurrence took place but explainable when one realizes that umpire Randall was behind the plate. A total of eight walks were issued by Eric Alejos in balls that both Eric and Steve Dodson, the catcher, could not explain as to why they were called as balls. Coupled with the only hit of the evening and a bad error and eight big Post 199 runs crossed the plate. Tho discouraged now, behind 8-4 we did not give up and Ricky Taylor gave us a single in the third tho we could not score him. In their third with Fred Palenske now on the mound they scored two more runs on a walk, an error and a single. We now trailed by the score of 10-4.

In our fourth we began to peck away as Kipp Noe singled and with two away

Wike Griffiths bombed a long blast over the left field wall to make it 10-6 - a long

homerun. In their fourth only a walk marred the inning - no runs. In our fifth

we went down in order as the Post #199 team garnered only a walk and an error but

no runs in their half. In our sixth we made it even more interesting, trailing

10-6 and one away, Steve Conwell beat out a slug bunt down the left field line

followed by the walk issued to Bruce Benteman, thereupon Mike Harmon sent a shot

over the right field wall scoring two runs ahead of him and giving us three runs

in all to make the score 10-9. Mike Griffiths kept it up by gettingthe potential

tying run with a single but Davey Lord's line shot to the shortstop who was coming

over to cover second. Mike Griffiths' break to steal second, turned into a fast

and snappy double play and took us out of the inning.

Now trailing 10-9 Fred experienced no trouble in their sixth other than a harmless walk. We came to the seventh with high hopes - they were stunted by the Post 199 hurler and they set us down in order 1-2-3, and we lost by the score of 10-9. Eric Alejos took the loss - his first against one victory and we took our sixth loss against sixteen wins. We had nine hits in all - two by Mike Griffiths, one his long homerun, two by Kipp Noe, one each by Mike Harmon, Dave Lord, Steve Dodson, Rick Taylor and Steve Conwell.

GAME TWENTY-THREE

Back in Topeka at Ripley Park on the 7th of July we hosted the Topeka
Suburban Reds under lead filled skies and threat of heavy rain. We sent Steve
Dodson to the hill to do hurling chores, and he was opposed by Gomez, a right
hander for the Reds. Steve gave up a hit to Scarlett on the first pitch of the
game for a double to the Reds and it turned out to be the only hit of the game
off Steve. Scarlett later attempted to score on an infield ground ball but was
thrown out at homeplate and it turned out to be the only threat as Steve experienced
no more hits off him tho he gave up two walks and a hit batsman later.

In our first we threatened with two away, Dave Lord singled, Steve walked, and Eric Alejos walked, but we could not garner a tally. In our second inning we did threaten again filling the bases this time with a walk to Kipp Noe, followed by still another walk to Mike Harmon, and an infield single to Mike Griffiths but no runs. Steve had no problems in striking out the side in their second. In or third we came up with the two runs to be the only runs of the games when Steve led off with a walk and Eric Alejos bombed a long triple into deep left center field to score Steve and moments later Eric scored on a double to left center by Kipp Noe. Steve continued to mow the opponents down around a walk issued in the third and a hit batsman in the fourth. We did little tho in our fifth, Steve Dodson walked after Davey Lord singled but we could not score. Suddenly the skies unloaded so heavily we could not continue with the game and the game was called at that point giving us a two to nothing victory and Steve a one hit shutout. We had six hits ^{in all} ourselves - two by Davey Lord and one each by Mike Griffiths, Eric Alejos a triple - Kipp Noe, a double, and Dave Greene a single. It was our 17th victory against 6 losses and Steve's 6th win against 2 losses.

GAME TWENTY-FOUR

We move to Kansas City for a doubleheader on Saturday, July 9th, which turned out to be a long hot and frustrating day. In a game that was delayed for nearly a half hour due to the lateness of the umpire and lo and behold who could the umpire

be when he does show up but Mr. Randall again. We had no choice but to go ahead and accept him as the umpire tho we were dubious about his abilities from the outset. In the first inning we sent Brett Holtom, our curveballing recent arrival, to the mound and he responded beautifully by hurling over the first six innings two hit shutout ball allowing a single in the second inning and a single in the fifth inning both not causing us any run problems. In the interim we were threatening and doing some scoring.

GAME TWENTY SIX

We move to game number twenty-six and in this game we move back to Topeka sunday the 10th of July to meet the Topeka Suburban Cardinals, the top team of their league, at Ripley Park. We sent Eric Elejos, our hard throwing left hander, against Mike Perry, a right hander for the Cardinals. In the Visitor's half they failed to score tho they had a base on balls and a hit batsman issued to them. In our half of the first with one away Mike Griffiths drew a walk and scored on Davey Lord's slash down the left field line for a double. Later Davey scored on Fred Malenske's single through the middle and we had two tallies. The Cardinals came back in their second when a walk was issued to Haefner and with one away he was able to score on a single by Besler, and the score was 2-1. In our second we wasted a single by Kipp Noe and a hit batsman issued to Eric Alejos. In the third the Cardinals did nothing against Eric tho they did fill the bases on two walks and an error. In our third we enjoyed another double by Davey Lord but it was to no avail as we could not score him. In their fourth Dixon tripled and later scored ma one baser by Besler to make the score two to three in favor of the Cardinals. In our fourth we had a walk issued to Steve Conwell and Mike Harmon but they were stranded. In their fifth Perry singled but he was thrown out attempting to steal. We sent big Steve Dodson to the hill and he responded beautifully with a shutout scattering six hits and striking out eight. Weamwhile we were enjoying heavy hitting at the plate. Tho we did nothing in our first, as did our opponent, in our second inning with one away Steve Bodson blasted along smash over the left field fence across the road and into the Santa Fe railroad shops to give us a one to nothing lead and an inspiration to begin hammering the ball. Todd Bohannon did that by singling, followed by Ricky Taylor's single. Bruce Benteman joined in the fun by singling and Mike Harmon walked, all along with a wild pitch gave us two runs and a 2-0 lead. Fred gave up a single in the first inning but no runs, and we came back in our first when Mike Harmon gained life as a result of an error and scored later on a grounder-fielder's choice. In their second inning they came up with a double but no runs while we came back with a hit but no runs. This time after tric Alejos had walked and Brett Holtom had singled, Kipp Noe filled the bases on a walk but that was as far as we went. In the third inning the Libby's came to life and scored three tallies on a base on balls, followed by a base hit and awalk and an error around a fielder's choice and we now trail for the first time in the game three to one. In our second inning we quickly tied it up When Dave Greene walked, Kipp Moe followed suite with another free pass and Rick Taylor beginning an enjoyable day at the bat singled Greene home with the tying tally. In their second they quickly moved back into the lead when Fred gave up a single followed by an error and a sacrifice and we were behind again, this time 2-1. In our third a walk was given to Fred Palenske but that was our only effort.
