














































Wichita, Kansas November 7, 1931

Dear Sir:-	
I have been contacted by members of the Wichita Chamber of Commerce, on the campaign to boost Kansas Coal.	
This idea happens to be one of my pet hobbies as I have been deeply interested in conditions in the mining districts of our State, having been Pest Commander of the Pittsburg American Legion Post in 1921.	
In my position as contact man between Labor and the Legion, during our State convention on Labor Day this year, I tried to promote the idea of having a display of Kansas coal in the way of a float and made a special trip to Pittsburg to arrange the matter.	
The operators and miners were in favor of the idea but I failed to get the proper results in time to act.	
I am sending you under separate cover, an advertisement which was passed to all of the delegates at a convention when we visited the coal mines at Wilkes Barre Pa. I think this is a fine piece of advertising and was wondering why something of the sort couldn't be worked out to push Kansas coal and especially to sell Kansas coal to Kansas people.
