Comes now P.N.Robinson, Sheriff of Crawford County, Kansas, and being first duly aworn, upon his oath deposes and says:-

That this efficient, who is the duly elected, qualified and acting Sheriff of Crawford County, Kansas, has the custody of one O.P. Jones and that the said O.B. Jones is one and the same person as taken from the Crawford County Jail at Cirard, Kansas to Topeka, Kansas by my Deputy Sheriff, Vernon Robinson, on Thursday, Nov. 19, 1931.

That on the evening of Wednesday, Nov.18, this affiant talked with the said O.P. Jones regarding the facts surrounding the events of the alleged crime charged against the said O.P. Jones in Texas, and that in said conversation with this affiant the said O.P. Jones stated as a fact, in answer to a question, as to where the transactions involving the soliciting and the selling of the insurance to one O.D. Cockerham took place, that the application was written in, and signed by O.D. Cockerham, in New Mexico, the said O.B. Jones naming the place of the transaction but which name has at this time avoided coming to my mind; that thereafter the Policy written on O.D. Cockerham was delivered to the said O.D. Cockerham by the said O.B. Jones while the said O.B. Jones and the said O.D. Cockerham were sitting in a car in front of the Post Office in Clovis, New Pexico. That in said conversation the said O.B. Jones further said that O.D. Cockerham requested information concerning insurance on his wife and that thereafter he, O.P. Jones, mailed a sample policy to O.D. Cockerham for inspection by the said O.D. Cockerham and his wife. That this affiant has never seen any complaint, indictment or warrant of any kind concerning the charges against O.B. 





My dear Judge:

I was in Topeka last Wednesday and called at your office to see you on a matter that I wanted to confer with you about and learned that you were in Lansing attending a Board Meeting.

I saw Attorney General Boynton and talked the matter over with him and he suggested that I write you a letter on the subject and send his office a copy, so I have concluded to do this today.

I have a client, Mr. James Taggart, an old man about seventy years of age, who has resided in this county and in Grant County, Kansas for many many years, but about eighteen months ago he went to San Diego, California where he met a lady about sixty-five years of age whom he had known when they were young folks together back in some eastern state. They soon renewed their former acquaintance and were married. He tried living with her for a few months, but found he was unable to do so and returned to Garden City, after leaving her a few months she prevailed on him to return. He did this and lived with her again for two or three months, but found that she made life so terrible for him that he could not stand it any longer so he slipped away one night and returned to Garden City.

About a month ago she came to Garden City to see him and try to induce him to return, but she had no success and returned to San Diego. He is now hearing from her attorneys demanding a financial settlement and I have very good reason to believe that their plan of forcing a property settlement is to have a warrant issued for Mr. Taggart on the charge of wife desertion and make application for requisition, if they do this I wanted to make sure that the requisition would not be honored without first giving us a hearing and it was with this object in mind that I called at your office.

Will you kindly keep this matter in mind and should an application be made for the arrest and return of Mr. Taggart to California, see that the application is set down for hearing and let us be given an opportunity
