The Ottawa High School football team is shown in this photograph from 1926. The team's record was 8-0, and they outscored their opponents 169 to 40. Because of their undefeated record and scoring dominance, the team was considered by some to be the unofficial state high school champions in 1926. Prior to Ottawa's 9-7 defeat of Olathe on November 19, 1926, news accounts described the game as "the battle for the high school football championship of the state." The team played its home games at Ottawa University's Cook Field. Pictured in the front row are (1 to r): Gordon Schuhmacher, quarterback; Lawrence Farmer, quarterback; and Donald Strahan, end.
