Dear Sir & Brother:—

I enclose you herewith a blank application for a charter for a warrant for a Lodge of I. O. O. F., which I see by the Chief you are laboring to establish in White Cloud. I trust you will be successful in accomplishing the object soon.

Our supplies for establishing new Lodges have arrived in Lawrence City, and will be here in a few days.

Be so kind, if you please, as to state in the Chief "The Grand Lodge I. O. O. F. of Kansas is now prepared to issue Warrants for the institution of Subordinate Lodges, and that their supplies have just been received from the Grand Lodge of the United States." Please add that "Blank petitions will be forwarded by the Grand Secretary, G. W. Brown, of Lawrence, Kansas, to whom applications for charters will be ~~forwarded~~ ^{directed}."
