Kansas State Temperance Union expense journals

This collection consists of 7 volumes of records from the Kansas State Temperance Union. The first volume lists the members and the dues they paid by local organization. The index lists the communities that have members listed and these communities have been included in the categories. Note: other communities are listed elsewhere in the records, particularly the speaker expenses volume. The second volume is the cash book (expense journal) for the years 1901-1904. Volumes three through five are the cash books for 1907-1910, 1909-1910, and 1910-1911. Volume 6 contains speaker expenses and contribution from the communities where they spoke, listed by name of speaker. Several speakers are listed. Volume 7 is an expense journal for 1907-1911. There are also some loose papers inserted into the volumes, mostly correspondence and form letters.



Aside from the foregoing statement of monies received and disbursed by the Treasurer, I am advised by the Secretary that other monies to the amount of \$4,683.51 have been collected during the period from January 22, 1901, to April 30, 1902, by state treasurers and field agents and distributed by them to their respective accounts of salary and expenses. This amount added to the \$6,040.68 received and the \$5,929.08 disbursed by the Treasurer during the time mentioned, makes the grand total of receipts \$10,739.25 and of disbursements \$10,628.65, leaving the balance the same as before stated.

The Treasurer's report to the preceding Convention, covering the period from January 10, 1900, to January 22, 1901, showed the amount of money received from all sources of the Kansas State Temperance Union to have been \$5,929.08. The amount contributed from all sources from January 22, 1901, to April 30, 1902, according to the present Treasurer's report, is \$1,730.25, or a sum greater than \$1,884.47, or \$2 per cent., than the total receipts in the period first mentioned. This is significant in that it forcibly indicates that the interest in the good work is not waning, but on the other hand, is being substantially encouraged by a very materially increased support—monetary as well as moral. Only one of the results of the vigorous and effective campaign so fearlessly waged by the Union, the beneficial influence of which is recognized and approved by all true believers in law, order, decency and sobriety.
