

U.S. District Court Indictment of Orville Chester Brown, John Brown, Sr., John Brown, Jr. et al.

During the "May Term" of the U.S. District Court for Lykins, now Miami County, a grand jury issued this indictment covering the April 16, 1856, actions (among others) of this group of "persons of evil minds and dispositions." These men, according to the indictment, "did unlawfully and wickedly conspire, combine, confederate and agree together mutually to aid and support one another in a forcible resistance to the enactments of the laws passed by the Legislature of said Territory of Kansas. . . . " Specifically, they had conspired "forcibly to resist and oppose the collector of taxes in and for the county and Territory aforesaid . . ."

The grand jurors surroned, empannelled, and sworn to enquire in and for the body of Lykens County, in the Ter ritory of Kansas, on their oath present that O.C. Brown, John Brown, Sr., John Brown, Jr., C.V. Dayton, Alexander & Garaner, Ruchard Mendenhall, Chas. A. Foster, Chas. H. Grane, William Partridge, and William Grestnut, late of said County, being persons of evil minds and dispositions, on (16) sixteenth day of April, 1856, eighteen hundred and fifty-six, anda on divers other days and times, both before and after that day, in the County of Lykens, and Territory aforesaid, did unlawfully and wickedly spire, combine, confederate and coree together nutually to aid and support one another in a forcible resistance to the enactionts of the laws passed by the Legislature of said Territory of Kansas, let the attempt to inforce such enactments come from whatever source it may.



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And the grand jurors aforesaid do further present on their oaths aforesaid that the said G.C. Brown, John Brown, Jr., G.V. Dayton, Alexander Garder Richard Mendenhall, Charles A. Foster, William Parace Widge and William Chestnut, of said county on said 16th day of April, 1866, and on divers other days and times, both before and after that day, in the county aforesaid, unlawfully and wickedly did conspire, combine, confederate, and agree together forcibly to resist and oppose the collector of taxes in and for the county and Territory aforesaid, and to use all the means and force necessary to prevent the execution of the laws of said Territory authorizing the assessment and collection of taxes to the evil example of all others and against the peace and dignity of the Territory of Kansas.
