Dear Wife

I enclose with this a letter from Owen written me from Albany. He appeared to be very much depressed before he left me; but there was no possible misunderstanding between us that I knew of. I did not pay Saml. Thompson; all I had ought to have given him for carry^{ing} us out; & wish you would make it up to him, if you can well: out of what I have sent you. If you get Hay of him I will send or fetch the money soon to pay for it. I shall send you some Newspaper soon to let you see what different stories are told of me. None of them tell things as I tell them.
