A warrant for Boyle's arrest was issued by the U. S. District Court of the Kansas Territory, First District, on June 28, 1859. Boyle was arrested and released on bond July 8, 1859.

Know all men by these presents; That we
George W Boyle as principal and
Wm Thaler
as security acknowledge ourselves to owe and be
indebted to the United States of America, in the first
and full sum of Five hundred dollars,
lawful money of the United States, to be levied on our
goods and chattels, lands and tenements, respectively,
upon the following express conditions. Whereas the
above bounden George W Boyle stands
indicted in the District Court of the United States
in and for the First Judicial District of the Territory
of Kansas, for the crime of aiding & abetting
a fugitive to escape, now the said George
W Boyle shall make his personal appearance before
the Court aforesaid, to answer the said crime on
the 12th day and 20th Monday of September A.D.
1859, at the Court house in the City of Lawrence
in said District, and continue in Court from
day to day during the Term, and from Term to
Term, and from day to day during each Term until
duly discharged, then this obligation to be void, else to
remain in full force and virtue, Given under our
hands and seals, this 5th day of July A.D. 1859

THE TERRITORY OF KANSAS,

To the Marshal of the United States for said Territory, Greeting;

We command you to take the body of George W. Boyle, so that you have him before the Judge of the District Court for said District, sitting for the trial of causes arising under the Constitution and Laws of the United States, in the City of Leavenworth, on the first day of the next regular term thereof, to be begun and held in said City on the 12th day of September A. D. 1859. Then and there to answer a certain crime of aiding & abetting a fugitive to escape with which he stands indicted in our said Court by the Grand Inquest of the United States in and for said District and Territory, and hereof fail not, and have you then and there this writ with the return of your doings thereon.

Witness, JAMES R. WHITEHEAD, Clerk of said Court, and the Seal thereof affixed at Office in the City of Leavenworth, this the 28th day of June A. D. 1859.
