Waller of Lincoln County N.H. as principal and
Trinity Morris as surety are held and firmly
bound unto the United States in the sum of
three hundred dollars to be paid to the United
States. to which payment well and truly
to be made and done to bind ourselves our
heirs Executors and Administrators and
every of them finally by their persons
dated with our Seal and dated this

to be null and void otherwise to be of full
force & virtue

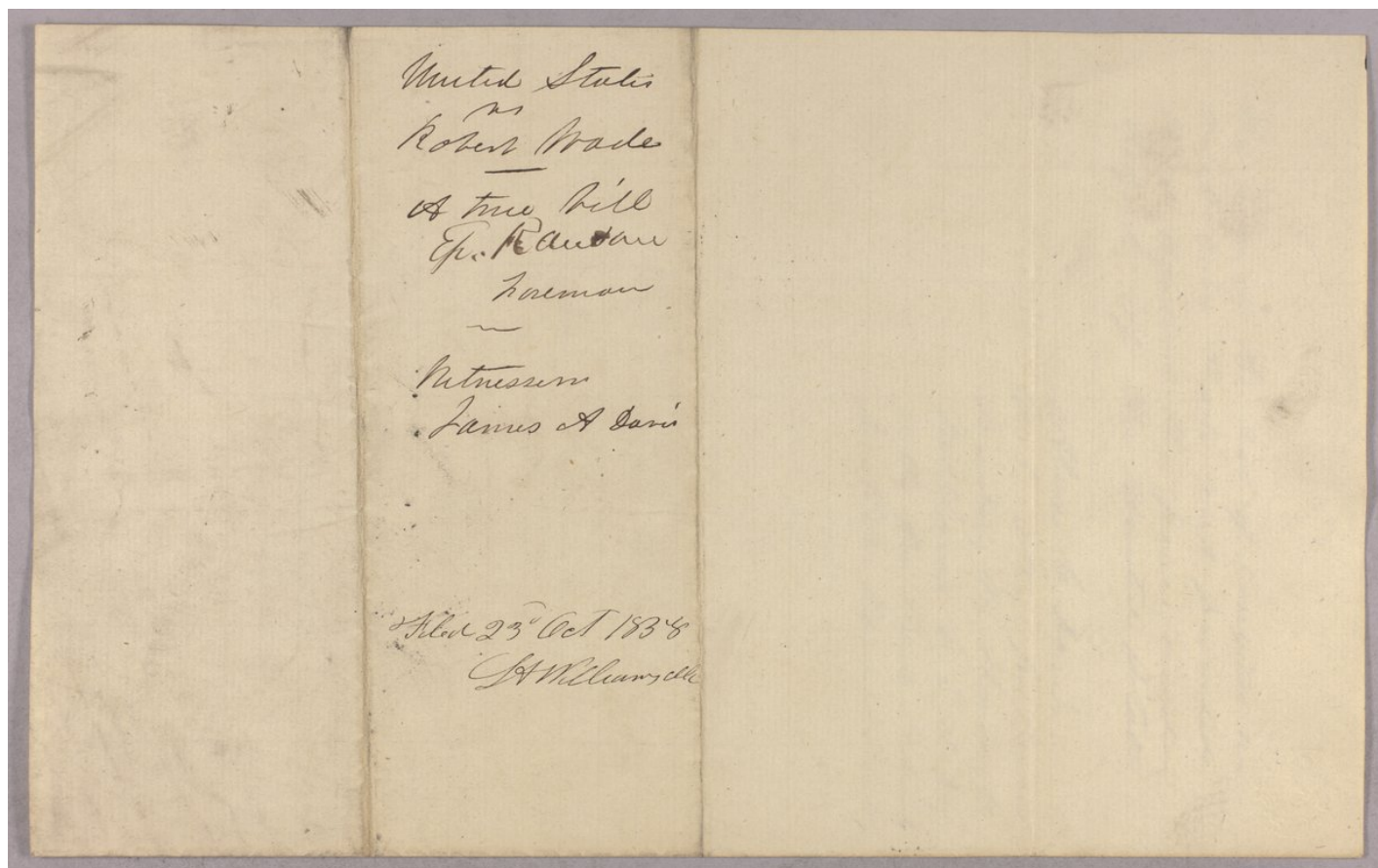
The Grand Jurors of the United States of America within and for the Third Judicial District in Kansas Territory summoned impaneled sworn and charged to inquire in and for the body of the District aforesaid upon their oath to present - That Robert Weid late of the District aforesaid did on the Tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight make a settlement upon the Miami Indian land, said land being secured to the Miami tribe of Indians by a treaty with the United States aforesaid, at & within the Third Judicial District, aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this Court and within the said Miami Indian lands as aforesaid contrary to

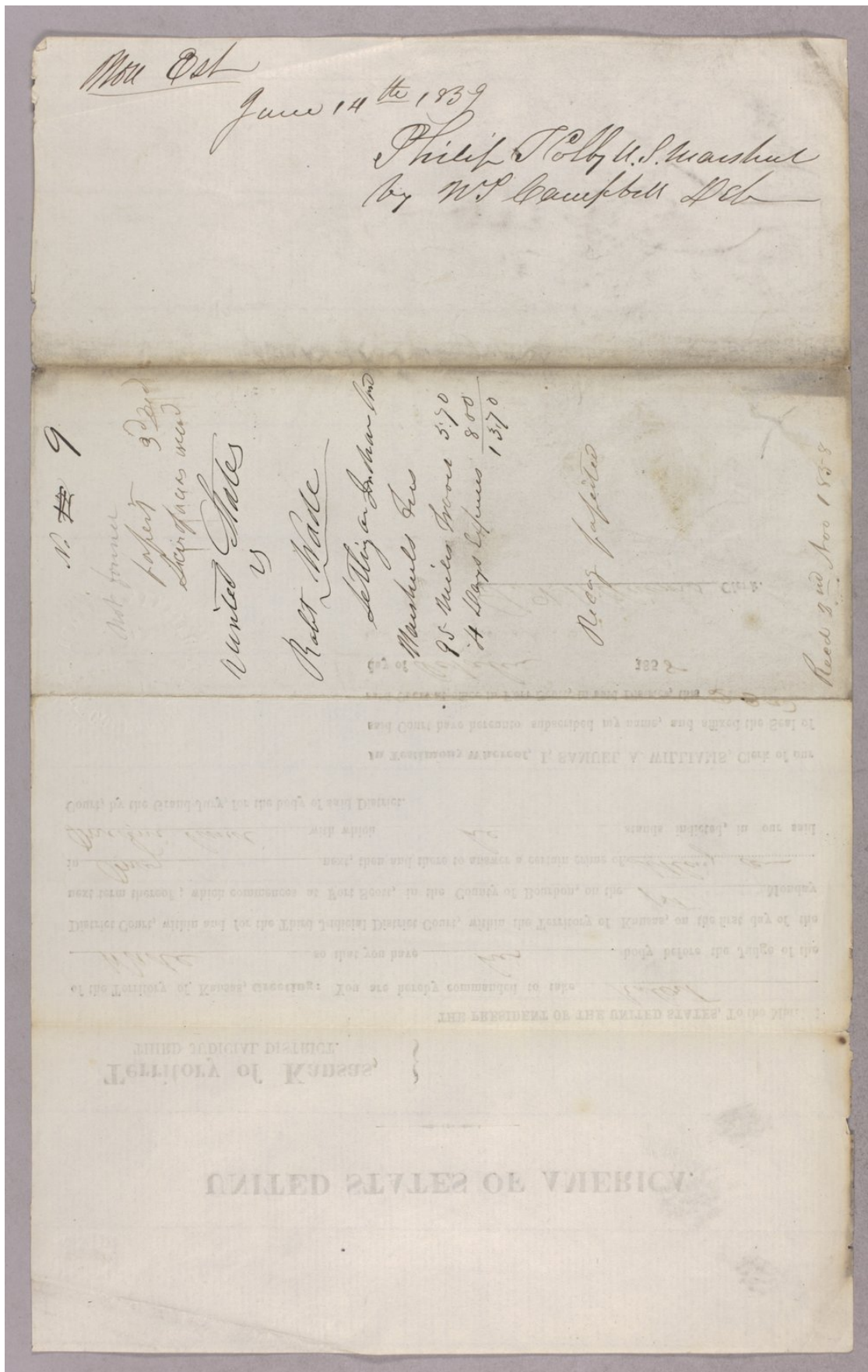

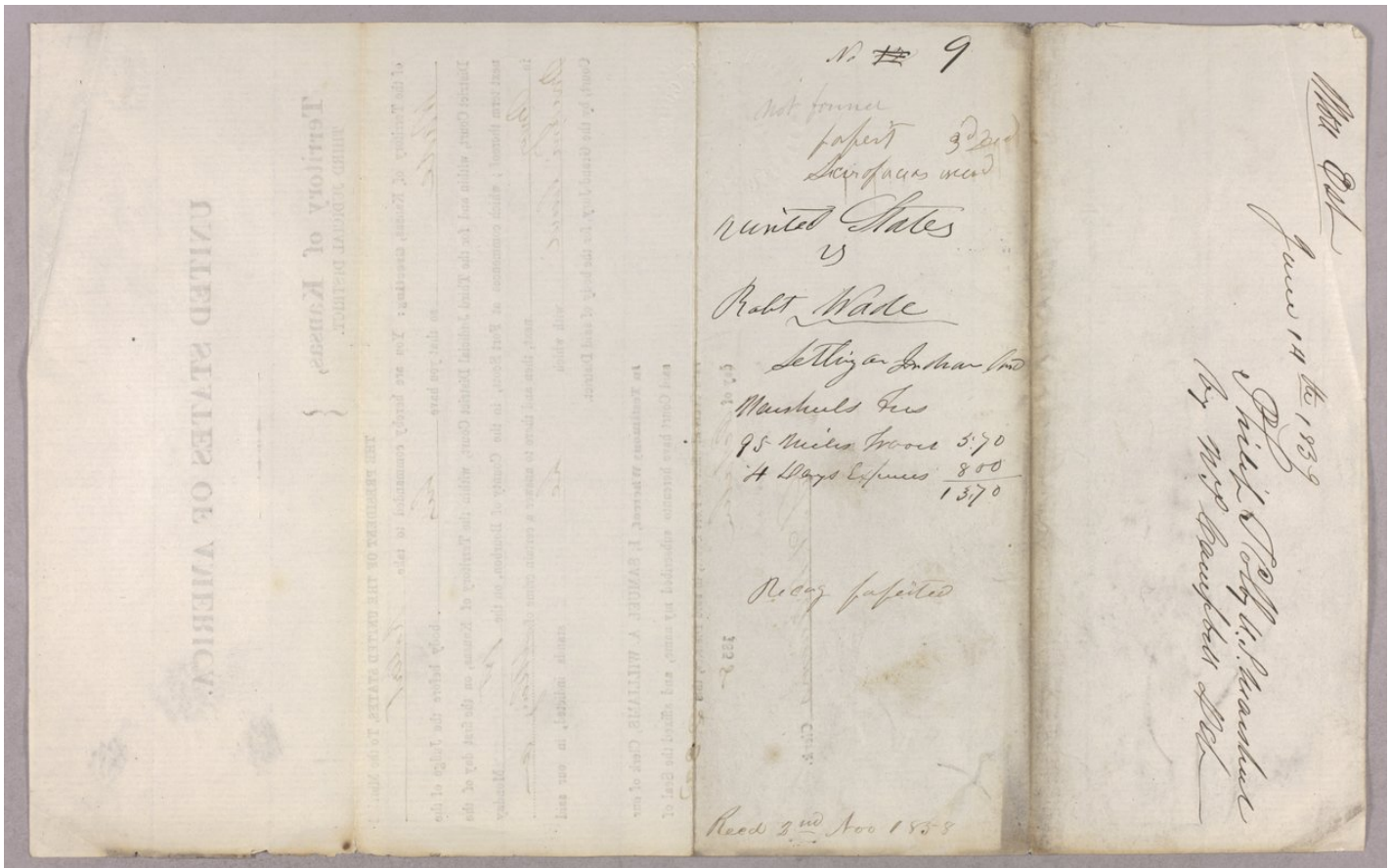
