Honorable Ben S. Paulen, Governor's Office, Topeka, Kansas.

My dear Governor:

I submit the following recommendations for Mrs. O. M. Babcock as State Vice Chairman of the Republican Party of Kansas. These gentlemen have all expressed themselves as not only being favorable to Mrs. Babcock's candidacy but anxious to assist her in obtaining the position.

You will note that the list includes all the State candidates with the exception of Mr. French the candidate for Auditor who merely said that if Mrs. Patrick were a candidate he would be favorable to her, she being from his Congressional District. Among the endorsements which I have are Hon. D. W. Mulvane, Senator Charles Curtis, Congressman D. R. Anthony, Hon. D.A.N. Chase, Hon. Frank Ryan, Hon. Geo. A. Allen, Hon. Wm. R. Baker and Maror Carl White. This, as you will see comprises all the State candidates with the exception of those for Auditor and Attorney General. The candidate for auditor is not unfriendly to Mrs. Babcock. I have not been able to obtain the endorsement of Wm. A. Smith, candidate for Attorney General, because I have not seen him, but Mrs. Charles R. Martin, Asst. Attorney General, is an enthusiastic supporter of Mrs. Babcock. Senator Capper is away, but Mr. Souders his private secretary expressed himself as having the understanding that Mrs. Babcock would be appointed and knowing that Senator Capper would be favorable to her candidacy. I will secure for you the endorsement of the Atchison County Republican Central Committee in a day or two.

I am apprising you of the position of these gentlemen so that you will know of the unanimity of the State candidates as well as the official leaders of the party in Kansas which shows that if Mrs. Babcock is appointed there can be no possibility of friction. I am sorry if I may seem importunate in this matter, but I really am not at all.
