New York June 17th 1790 -

Sir

I have the honor to send you herein inclosed
two copies duly authenticated of the Resolution respecting
the arrears of pay due to the troops of the lines of the States
of Virginia and North Carolina; Also of the Act for giving
effect to the several Acts therein mentioned in respect to
the State of Rhode Island and Providence plantations; also
of the Act for relief of Thomas Paine and company;
Also of the Resolution for the publication of Treaties
made or which shall be made under the authority of
the United States, and of being with sentiments of the
most perfect respect -
