To the UNITED STATES CONGRESS:

Impeach Herbert Hoover, oust him from office, oust with his his Cabinet to ignominy and exile, erect an interim "administration" according to Law and so safeguard its procedure that at all costs this Nation shall resume a proper and dignified course to the destiny its Founders anticipated in the immortal Declaration of Independence and provided for in the Constitution of the United States.

As participating in the conspiracies and treasons established in the impeachment and for the ouster of Herbert Hoover, and for venal personal treasons, oust Charles Evans Hughes from the Supreme Court of the United States and to exile.

For guilt in constructive treason, even if under coercion, oust from your honorable Senate those three members whose conduct has been treasonable flagrantly. Oust the arrest, imprisonment and final exile of Nicholas Murray Butler for sedition and for treason in giving aid and comfort to the enemies of this Nation.

Suspend the activities and confiscate the properties of the Carnegie Foundations in all their ramifications as inimical to the wellbeing of the Nation.

Suspend publication, then acquire and publish in behalf of the Nation all those daily newspapers, periodicals and "organs" which have contributed to all and several the conspiracies and treasons that are the bases of impeachment and ouster of the respective traitors, which publications are owned and/or dominated by persons or corporations of foreign citizenry and/or by citizens of this Nation who have come to be treasonable through evil alliances, association, cajolery, cozenry and/or intimidation proceeding from sources within or without the Nation to that end.

As measures of emergency necessity, provide for the common defence and general welfare by all means the efficacy and utility of which became common knowledge in the period of the recent war; and seize legally and imposed for National service all gold metal coined or otherwise; control and limit the emission of paper currency; suspend the operation of stock and commodity exchanges; provide machinery for general commerce and finance, including security sales, by adequate extension of the functions and facilities of the Federal Reserve Banks and associated institutions under the control of new officials sympathetic with and responsive to the UNITED STATES CONGRESS and under penalties, including the death penalty, for misfeasance in duty and/or breach of trust; all to the end that the common defence and general welfare shall be served and performed appropriately, having present for guidance to legislation to do these needful things the extent and penetration of the conspiracies that have evaded the treasons the subject of the impeachment and ouster from office of the commanding culprits and the tenuous yet isponderably-powerful influences swaying citizens to offence and dishonor by suggestion and insinuation apparently innocent but eternally vile and pervasively potent.

Fix "market values" of commodities and securities to a period-average under penalties to avoid inducement to and profit in transactions under duress of fear, &c. Utilize the Census statistics and municipal machinery to recruit the power of the Nation and to provide emergency rations and housing for citizens in need.

Establish martial law, withdraw diplomatic representation while permitting the continuance of consular service to facilitate commerce; dismiss diplomatic representatives in all cases where, in individual practice, they have flouted the Fundamental Law of the Nation and the amenities of common courtesy by procedure contrary to the Constitution; embargo exportations of private funds in money or evidences of wealth and value; and, in all ways, put the Nation as if in a state of siege so that fullest and least-modified and/or interrupted scope for readjustment of the affairs of the Nation shall be had conveniently for capable and completely efficient action.

**REMEMBER** Refresh your memories NOW by reading word for word the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United States including the Tenth Amendment, the speech of Abraham Lincoln at Springfield, Illinois, January, 1857, the speech by Senator McKellar on September 25, 1869, confirming what was said by Richard Washburn Child about naval yardsticks and parity and reported in The New York Times of September 11, 1869, showing our "naval defence" as "HOPELESSLY SECOND OR THIRD CLASS"; read my "Memoranda for a Resolution for the Impeachment of Warren Gamaliel Harding;- in possession of Representative John N. Garner, of Texas, and the loosely-arranged facts in my papers of June 21, 1929 on the "VETO POWER" and of September 11, 1929, on the query: "WHO ARE THE 'SLACKERS'?"

Equipped thus, consider reminiscentially in detail the conditions antecedent, incident and subsequent to the entrance by our Nation into the "World War"; Reconstruct, step by step, our National emergence from "unpreparedness" to the full panoply of power with four millions of men under arms, with the strongest navy in the world, with tremendous wealth in production of the essentials to National integrity of food, shelter, clothing for all and work by all mandatory:

Review the facts, historical now, that France was whipped, British Empire beaten disgracefully, Italy down and out, Belgium submerged by German occupation, Russia in revolt, with the balance of real power for the welfare of the world in OUR hands; and now, by treasonable legation, in British hands to our prejudice:

Revisit now the mechanics by which our power was dissipated, our armies demobilized, production halted, "DEFLATION" present, and HISSY epidemic:

Recall the convocation of the Conference on Limitation of Armament and its incidence and outcome with the scuttling of our armada responding to the menace that Charles Evans Hughes voiced when he told the late Senator Underwood how a "NATIONAL CALAMITY" impended unless the Senate ratified instantaneously the deeds of that Conference:

Reminiscence and retrace the events and atmosphere of the propaganda for debt cancellation, "peace", Dawes Plan, Young Plan and the fear-inspiring head-lines in the press leading up to the visit by MacDonald and the despatch of the Commission to the London Naval Conference whose testimony is now fresh in your ears and eyes:

Then read how Winston Churchill, erstwhile chancellor of the exchequer of British Empire, - and who visited Herbert Hoover at the White House in the Summer of 1929, - by a breach of parliamentary etiquette has just revealed the substance of the menace that TRAITOR Hughes interpreted as a "NATIONAL CALAMITY": Churchill had sent a cable to Balfour at Washington in 1921 instructing him to deny naval parity to our Nation at the cost of a "rupture", which meant that the beaten British Empire, victor by our power, was prepared to employ Japan to fight us and "DIVIDE THE 'SPOILS'".



Your letter of May 14th written to Governor Reed in regard to the Topeka State Hospital has been referred to me for answer.


