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

Dear Sir:

Your letter of January 7th written to Governor Reed in regard to the state of Kansas paying you for some detective work which you claim to have done has been referred to me for answer.

As I understand your letter, you are trying to get the state to pay you for what you did without being employed by the state. I wish to inform you that the state has no authority whatever to pay your claims, and if such a claim were presented to the state auditor he would have to refuse to O.K. it.


The only way you could be paid for any services you may have rendered would be through your representative, and he would have to introduce a special bill in the legislature for the purpose of paying you. No money can be paid out of the state treasury unless it is appropriated by the legislature for a specific purpose, and then the money has to be applied to that purpose and to no other.


