Dear Sir:

We would like to have Governor Reed appoint a justice of the peace for Oberlin City Township, Decatur County.

We have had only one justice in this township since last election, Mr. M. W. Maddox. In the last six weeks Mr. Maddox has not been able to work regularly on account of sickness, and I understand is considering withdrawing from the duties of the office.

There is no justice, qualified, in this county closer than Jennings or Norcatur, Kansas, each about 20 miles from Oberlin.

In the position of justice other than that held by Mr. Maddox, R. A. Marks was the last qualified justice, having been elected in 1926. Mr. Marks is now dead. Mr. J. W. Railsback was elected to this office in 1928, but failed to qualify.


If you consider this office formerly held by Mr. Marks vacant, we would like to have an appointment to it for Mr. J. G. Hanson, of Oberlin, Kansas. Mr. Hanson is associated with his brothers in a feed and grinding business here at Oberlin, and has been police judge here since last city election. He is very well recommended for this office. Several other likely men for the office have advised the appointment of Mr. Hanson.


Dear Governor Reed:


