Boston Fall Massachusetts begins to move. I have commenced the move in N.Y. City hope soon to have it fairly under way.

What are you doing through the State? Time now is more precious than it has ever been before. We have until the sun sets on Nov. 4. On that day the election will have sealed.

The Kuffians will be barely held in check until that hour.

Fear will continue to patch up a peace until then - no longer!

We must work now desperately. All the means we can get.

Pray, beg, entreat - do every thing now - now! There

Albany & through the State.
