Executive Committee, Session.
Called to Order by the Chairman, Mr.
Winchell. Geo. S. Hillyer appointed Secy;
No 1. On Motion, Resolved That Secy, Hillyer,
be furnished with a Horse belonging to
the Central Committee for his use on a
trip through the Territory to be returned
in like good condition as he?
No 2. On Motion Resolved That a load
of provisions & clothing or its value
in Money be appropriated to the relief
of Topeka, Goshopp's Falls, Council
City & the region of the Col. Wood
to be distributed under the direction
of the Committeeman of the respective
district which they represent.
No 3. On Motion Resolved that when we
adjourn we adjourn to meet at
Washington, on the 28th inst.
No 4. On Motion, Resolved that our agent
be, and is hereby instructed not
to sell any Horses, belonging to this
Central Committee prior to the day of
said Public Sale ordered on the 29th inst.
No 5. On Motion Resolved that the Secy of
this Committee give written instructions
to our Special Agent, Mr. Rob. Morrow
to proceed to Nebraska City and then ^{thence}
such disposition of all property belonging
to this Comt., as in his judgment is
most judicious.
No 6. On Motion Resolved that the Secy of

Leavenworth City be authorized to
to entertain Mrs. Margaret Bamber until
she can procure her a passage to St.
Louis. She having the money to pay her
passage.

Mr. 7. On Motion Resolved That the Chair
instruct our agent Col. Eldridge to
purchase & send provisions & clothing to
difficult ^{points} as specified in Resolution
No. 2.

Mr. 8. On Motion Resolved That R. H. Hatcher
be allowed to retain a certain Cook
Store belonging to the S. B. C. Committee by
receiving for the same to the Central
Court as per Rule.
