Caleb Pratt, who seems to be acting as Stearns' agent in Lawrence, Kansas Territory, at this time, writes regarding the Joseph Gardner request for firearms. On his own initiative, Pratt "allowed him [Gardner] to take 7 Rifles and 4 sabres to his house with permission to use the same if necessary . . ." This was a temporary loan that awaited Stearns' endorsement.

Sir

Ingersoll, Benson & Gardner
called on me this morning, and
informed me that there is an urgent
need of weapons of defence at
Mr Gardner, and that no weapons
can be obtained by the most diligent
efforts.

Under the cir-
cumstances, believing the articles
to be perfectly safe at Mr. G's
I have allowed him to take
7 Rifles and 4 Sabres to his house
with permission to use the same
if necessary and to be returned
on my order, taking the re-
ceipt of the above gentlemen
therefor

One of them will write

Caleb S. Pratt to George L. Stearns

to you asking for an order
from you for the arms or
the use of them and will
doubtless state more fully
the occasion &c

I do not deem that I
have any instructions for the
disposition of the "materiel"
but under the circumstances
believed that a temporary
deposit of them as I herein
advise you of, would be in
accordance with your wishes
and not contrary to the let-
ter of the trust

Will you be kind
enough to send me an abstract
of the memo^s furnished by
Mr Willis containing num-
ber of different articles
